The Academic Profession in Comparative Perspective

A few years ago a survey was undertaken on the profile, the views of academics at institutions of higher education in 19 countries all over the world. Most of the about 10 books on the project "The Changing Academic Profession" will be published in 2013. In a recent project ("The Academic Profession in Europe", respective CAP surveys and new EUROAC surveys provide information on altogether 12 European countries. The question will be addressed whether can identify a "European higher education profession" or whether differences between countries, between professors and junior staff as well between academics at universities and other institutions of higher education challenge such a view of single profession.

Ulrich Teichler: Curriculum Vitae

Professor at the International Centre for Higher Education Research (INCHER-Kassel), (formerly Centre for Research on Higher Education and Work), University of Kassel, Kassel, Germany, since 1978, and Director of the Centre for 16 years. Born in 1942; study of sociology at the Free University of Berlin (Dipl.-Soz. in 1968); researcher at the Max Planck Institute for Educational Research, Berlin (1968-1978); guest researcher at the National Institute for Educational Research, Tokyo, Japan (1970-1972); dissertation on higher education and social selection in Japan (Dr. phil. of the University of Bremen, 1975). Former dean of faculty (for one year) and vice president of the University of Kassel (for two years). Professor on part-time or short-term basis at the Northwestern University, Evanston/Illinois, U.S. (1986-1992), College of Europe, Bruges, Belgium (1994-1996) and Hiroshima University, Japan (2004); visiting professor of the Open University, UK (2007-2012); other temporary teaching assignments in Argentina, Austria, Germany and Norway; special honours and prizes at universities in Argentina, Costa Rica, Sri Lanka, Syria and the U.S.; extended periods as research fellow in Japan and the Netherlands; altogether visits of about 80 countries.

Consultancy activities and expert reports for UNESCO, OECD, World Bank, European Commission, Council of Europe and many other international and national governmental organizations, and many international and national umbrella organizations in the higher education system; various functions in evaluation schemes and involvement in many evaluation activities (e.g. OECD reviewer of national education systems in four countries; chairman of the board of the Central Evaluation and Accreditation Agency in Hannover, Germany).

More than 1,000 academic publications; key research areas: higher education and the world of work, international comparison of higher education systems, international cooperation and mobility in higher education; additionally: education and social selection, the academic profession, access and admission, continuing professional education, and evaluation in higher education. Former or current co-editor of various academic journals, e.g. "Higher Education", "European Journal of Education", and "Das Hochschulwesen". Member, and from 1998-2004 member of the Board, of the International Academy of Education (1992-), member of the Academia Europeae (1992-) and coordinator of the expert group "Higher Education, Research and Culture in European Society" (HERCULES, 2003-2009), former chairman of the Consortium of Higher Education Researchers (CHER) (1988/1989 and 1992-1998), former president (1998-2002) and distinguished member (2003-) of EAIR, Vice-President (1986-) and Fellow (2008) of the Society for Research into Higher Education (SRHE). Award of the Research Prize by CIEE (1997), the Comenius Prize by UNESCO (1998), and the ERASMUS Special Prize 2008 by the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD). Doctor honoris causa of the University of Turku, Finland (2006); sponsor of the Ulrich-Teichler Prize for the best doctoral and master theses in Germany on higher education (2008-).

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
