CALL FOR APPLICATIONS
FOR NATIONAL HIGHER EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP
for academic year 2022/2023

Based on the decision of the minister responsible for education and pursuant to Article 64 (5) of Act CCIV of 2011 on National Higher Education and Government Decree 51/2007. (III.26.) on Student Allowances and on Certain Student Fees in Higher Education (hereinafter referred to as: Decree), the Corvinus University of Budapest announces a call for applications for 25 people for academic year 2022/2023.

- 1)** A National Higher Education Scholarship is awarded for the period of a whole academic year (10 months). Based on Article 114/D. (1) c) of the Act on National Higher Education, the normative amount of the National Higher Education Scholarship is HUF 400,000/year.
- 2)** Based on the call for applications issued by the minister responsible for education, the following students may apply for National Higher Education Scholarships:
 - a)** who participate in full-time bachelor's programmes or second-cycle or single-cycle master's programmes, or
 - b)** who registered for at least two semesters during their studies,
 - c)** who have active student status in the semester of submitting the application,
 - d)** who earned at least 55 credit points during their studies,
 - e)** who achieved outstanding academic results during their given programme, a Grade Point Average of at least 4.5 in every semester, at least 23 credit points in every semester, and
 - f)** carried out outstanding professional and community work.
- 3)** Students attending master's programmes, who started their studies at our University in the second semester of academic year 2021/2022 and meet the conditions defined in point 2, a)-f), may also apply for the scholarship. In their case,

their results achieved in their first semester may be taken into consideration as follows:

- a) their National Higher Education Scholarship average is their Grade Point Average achieved in the second semester of academic year 2021/2022,
 - b) points received for professional and community activities shall be considered with double values, except for TDK (Students' Scientific Associations) or OTDK (National Conference of Students' Scientific Associations) points.
- 4) Students who sit for a final exam in the given training cycle within a multi-cycle programme in the period of submitting the application are not allowed to submit an application for the National Higher Education Scholarship, except for students in bachelor's programmes if they are likely to continue their studies in a master's programme in the next semester and meet the conditions specified in point 2, a)-f). If the student finishes his/her studies - according to the training programme - in an odd semester (i.e. at the end of the autumn semester of academic year 2022/2023), he/she remains entitled to the National Higher Education Scholarship if he/she continues his/her studies in the next semester (i.e. in the spring semester of academic year 2022/2023).
 - 5) You can submit your application in Neptun via the 'National Higher Education Scholarship 2022/2023' application available in menu item Administration/Applications/Application Forms, by entering the data, uploading the necessary documents and certificates, and submitting the application by the deadline.
 - 6) Deadline for submitting the applications:
 - 23 June 2022, 10:00 – 27 June 2022, 12:00
 - 7) Incomplete applications shall not be accepted, additional documents shall not be submitted.
 - 8) In the evaluation of the application, the scores earned in individual categories shall be considered with the following weights:

evaluation of academic results	60%
evaluation of scientific activity	30%
general evaluation of public affairs and student association activity	10%
general evaluation of sports activity	
professional activity in student association

- 9) Academic results shall be evaluated on the basis of the Grade Point Average.
- 10) The activities to be evaluated in individual categories, the scores to be obtained and the samples of the necessary certificates are included in the annex to the call for applications.
- 11) The final score of the applying student shall be formulated according to the scoring system in the annex, and maximum 200 points can be achieved in total.
- 12) Applications will be checked and ranked by the Student Social Committee.
- 13) National Higher Education Scholarships may be granted to students who meet both of the following two conditions at the same time:
 - a) their total score from the maximum possible 200 points reaches or exceeds 60 points, and
 - b) in the established ranking, based on their score achieved in the current call for proposals issued by the minister for education, they are included in the first twenty-five (25) students with the highest scores.
- 14) Under the powers delegated by the Senate, the Vice-Rector for Education makes proposals to the competent minister about granting National Higher Education Scholarships.
- 15) The competent minister shall decide about the granting of scholarships.
- 16) Rules of disbursing the National Higher Education Scholarship
 - a) The National Higher Education Scholarship - based on the ranking suggested by the University - is granted by the minister responsible for education to the selected individuals.
 - b) The monthly amount of the National Higher Education Scholarship in academic year 2022/2023 is HUF 40,000 / person / month on the basis of Article 24 (1) of the Decree.
 - c) A student who won a National Higher Education Scholarship shall not be excluded from study scholarships.
 - d) The National Higher Education Scholarship may be granted for the period of one academic year (10 months). Pursuant to Article 24 (6) of the Decree, if the student's student status or eligibility for scholarship is terminated or suspended for any reason on the basis of valid legal regulations (e.g. deferring studies for a year, completion of studies, or based on point 4, the applying student does not continue his/her studies at the University in a master's programme), the disbursement of the scholarship shall not continue after the termination or the start of suspension. A scholarship won for academic year 2022/2023 shall be disbursed in academic year 2022/2023 only. The disbursement of the National Higher Education Scholarship shall not be rescheduled beyond the academic year following the application.

- 17) An application for legal remedy shall be submitted within 15 days of the communication of the decision, addressed to the Student Appeals Committee in Neptun.
- 18) Based on the proposal of the University, the list of students provided with National Higher Education Scholarship shall be given to the Rector of the University in writing.

Annex

The Student Social Committee shall evaluate the applications according to the following scoring system:

Maximum 200 points may be achieved.

1. Evaluation of academic results (maximum 120 points):

a) The calculation of academic results is based on the simple arithmetic average of the Grade Point Average in the last two closed active semesters of the student (hereinafter as: National Higher Education Scholarship average).

$$\text{Scholarship average} = \frac{\sum 1,2 \times \text{kredit}^K \times \text{érdemjegy}^K + \sum \text{kredit}^V \times \text{érdemjegy}^V}{\sum 1,2 \times \text{kredit}^K + \sum \text{kredit}^V}$$

- i. where K is: all compulsory/compulsory optional subjects stated in the sample curriculum/operational curriculum and subjects compulsory in specialisation/academic specialisation
- ii. V: optional subjects taken according to the sample curriculum

b) the calculation of the scholarship average and the average academic results weighted with credits is based on the results of all the subjects taken by the student in the affected semester(s).

- i) Marks accomplished under a further (parallel) student status established in another higher education institution, in any internal parallel training cannot be included in the calculation of the scholarship average.
- ii) Subjects closed with a fail grade or with a 'missed exam' or 'no show' entry are included in the numerator of the formula with zero marks, an exception to this is, if the student, in the case of a given subject in the course of improving a successful examination does not attend the examination and receives a 'not present/absent' entry; in this case the last successful grade and credit value of the given subject is indicated in the numerator.
- iii) Subjects prescribed for students in master's programmes - in the higher education admission procedure, in the course of the preliminary credit recognition procedure, following the recognition of credits archived in relation to prior studies - as mandatory conditions of admission, in addition to credits required for the degree, in parallel with the training aimed at obtaining a master's level degree are not recognized in the scholarship average.

- iv) Regardless of whether the student accomplished the subjects based on a guest student status established in a higher education institution in Hungary or abroad, any subject accomplished on the basis of a guest student status must be considered as if the student accomplished them at the University and their results must be included in the calculation of the scholarship average with the credit values and marks approved by the Credit Transfer Committee.

In the case of a National Higher Education Scholarship average of 4.5, the student gets 60 points, while in the case of a National Higher Education Scholarship average of 5.00, the student gets 120 points. In the case of an average between these two limits, the score to be earned is defined with the following formula:

Score of academic results:

$60 + (\text{National Higher Education Scholarship average} - 4,50) \times 120$, rounded to integer, where:

- 60 is the minimum possible academic score,
- 4.50 is the minimum National Higher Education Scholarship average, for which academic points can be awarded,
- 120 is the multiplier to be used for the definition of the actual score.

When rounding the score of academic results, the general rules of rounding shall be followed. E.g. from 60.00 to 60.49, it is 60 points, from 60.50 to 61.49, it is 61 points.

E.g. the students' scholarship average in the autumn semester: 4.66, the scholarship average of the spring semester: 4.72, based on the simple arithmetic average of the scholarship averages of the last two active semesters, the National Higher Education Scholarship average is: 4.69 Based on that, the student gets 83 points for his/her academic results - $60 + (4.69 - 4.50) \times 120 = 82.80$

In the case of National Higher Education Scholarship averages between the two limit values, possible scores are included in the following table:

If the student submits a TDK paper co-authored by him/her or other scientific work, he/she is eligible for the following points:

- if the paper has two authors, the applicant can get 70% of the maximum points,
- if the paper has more than two co-authors, the student can get the maximum eligible points divided by the number of authors.

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Only scientific activities carried out in the second semester of academic year 2021/2022 and in the previous semester with active status shall be recognised. Points for the items indicated in the table can be granted only once. On each document certifying scientific activities and attached to the application, the student shall enter and sign which activity in the table is certified with that document. The scanned version of the original documents containing the scores proposed by the person issuing the certificate, or the pdf version of the certificate sent from the university e-mail address of the teacher shall be uploaded by the applicant when he/she submits his/her application through the Neptun.
