**Project title**: Populism and the role of in-group solidarity in Hungary

**Project description**\*: This project aimed to achieve two goals, namely developing further the concept of implicit populism and analyzing the attitudes of pro and anti-Trumpists. On the one hand, a theoretical contribution was pursued, on the other, we aimed to find differences or similarities between Hungarian respondents' attitudes toward Donald Trump, considering anti-elitism, in-group solidarity, desire to act without solidarity, metaphysics and opposition to pluralist forms.

Achieved result(s)\*: The project revealed two important findings. First, a new subdimension of implicit populism was developed by which the "enemy" could be detected in content analysis when the communicator articulates its presence. On the other hand, unarticulated threats (when we do not know who or what is the source of the problem) such as "danger," "problem," "hazard" might also appear in populist styles.

Second, our other contribution shows that there is only one significant difference between the Hungarian pro and anti-Trumpists' attitudes, namely in-group solidarity. Respondents who endorse Trump think that belonging to and defending their inner circles are crucial in their everyday lives. The results suggest that Trumpists think that protecting inner circles from external threats maintains cohesion within their national in-group.
