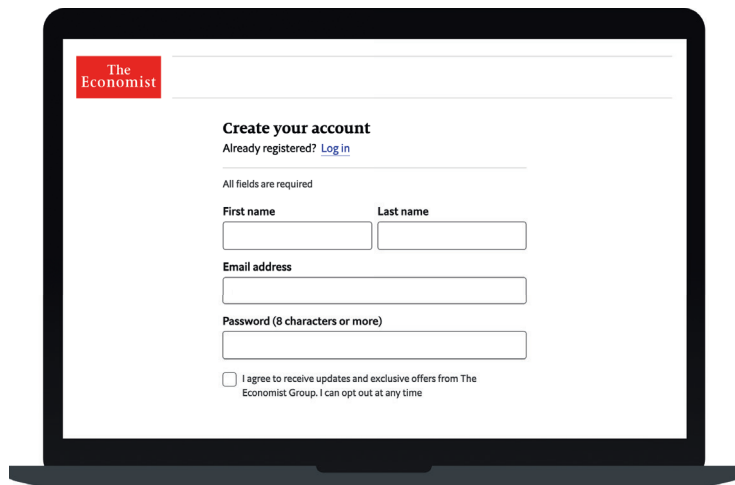

You will receive a verification email titled “You’ve been given an Economist subscription” from no-reply@economist.com, where you can verify your email address

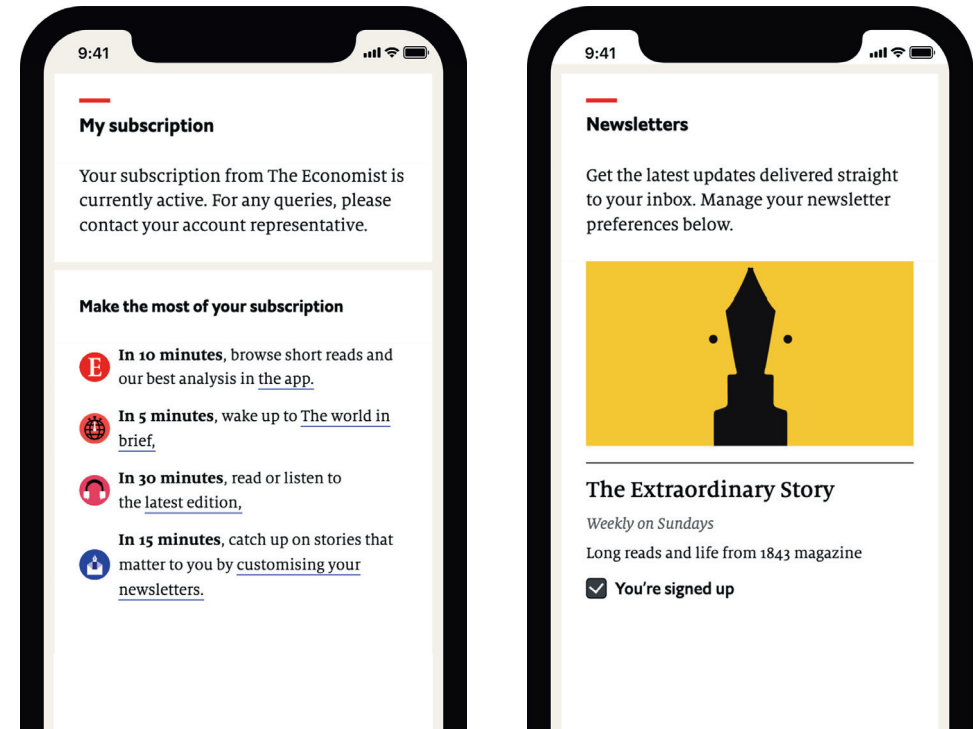

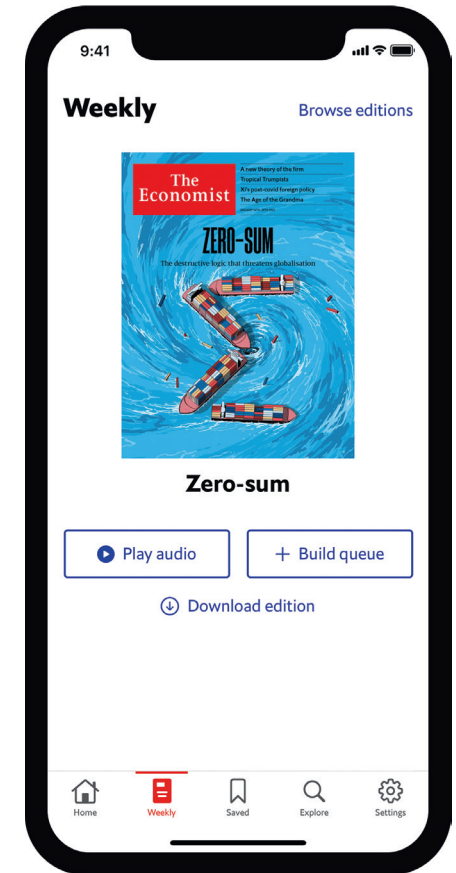
