

Molly Dugan is a Professor of Journalism and Communication Studies at California State University, Sacramento, a 30,000-student public university in Northern California where she teaches classes in public affairs reporting, newswriting, media literacy and mass communication. She developed and teaches a popular senior seminar, War, Peace and the Media. Her recent research involves disinformation and reporting on conflict. Her ongoing research areas include government/political reporting, journalism ethics, race and gender in the media and community engagement.

Molly is a Fulbright scholar this spring at Corvinus University. She spent fall semester as a visiting professor at the University of Lodz in Poland.

Molly currently serves as president of the Board of Directors for Open California, a non-profit journalism outlet with a mission to inform Californians about public policy and state government and engage with public officials, advocates and political interests, and she is past president of the local branch of the American Association of University Women, a national non-profit that advocates for educational opportunities for women and girls. She is an active volunteer in the Sacramento community for many professional and community causes.

Before she came to the university, she spent more than a decade as a news reporter at numerous newspapers, including The Sacramento Bee, The Press-Enterprise (Riverside, Ca.) and The Modesto Bee. She has a bachelor's degree in Comparative Literature from the University of California, Davis and a master's degree in Journalism from Northwestern University.
