Further info about research: Neoclassical economics generally assumes rational agents in its models, while empirical evidence suggests that everyday patterns of human behavior tend to fall quite far from it. In our project, we would like to explain how those types of manners can be modelled, that are labelled as 'irrational' according to the classical economics. Irrational agents tend to have non-standard time preferences. We wish to demonstrate the technical tools required to model the self-interested decision makers, who maximize their utility, nevertheless having the possibility to change their mind; with other words making inconsistent decisions in an intertemporal setting. We will introduce two types of irrational agents: the naïve and the sophisticated. The naïve agent restarts the optimization process in each period, which can lead to procrastination. The sophisticated one is well-aware of the potential procrastination, hence, in case it is possible, she tries to prevent it. In our study, we have also set the goal to extend the model of intertemporal consumption choice of the rational agent in a finance economy from 2 periods to 3 periods to derive the CAPM equation. Thus, we will construct a 3-period general equilibrium model with one product to derive the consumption based version of the well-known CAPM formula, which would be an internationally unprecedented result. The main intention of this project is to examine how this 3-period model would look like in case we replace the rational agents with naïve or sophisticated ones. These results could serve educational purposes as well, since they can be used to drive current theoretical models closer to reality.
