Why would you like to study at Corvinus University of Budapest? c. What would you like to achieve by completing this program? How did you choose this program? d. What are your professional plans and prospects after completing our program? e. In your opinion, what are your main strengths and weaknesses? f. Do you have any questions to us? 3.Assessment of academic competence (based on readings, 8') a. Explain one of the main social / economic issues with which the study is concerned. b. Is that policy problem relevant in your country? [if the issue is relevant to applicant] Please elaborate it. d. What sort of policy solutions are proposed in the study? Do you agree with them? e. [if the issue is not relevant to applicant] Explain a related, major social / economic policy problem of your country. What type of policies can be used to solve the problem? Throughout the interview we assess whether the applicant ... • possesses the attitudes necessary to study and practice the program's area of knowledge: problem-oriented, analytical, open to different views, communicative; • has a general overview of the area; • presents their views convincingly, utilizing proper academic English; • gives thoughtful, competent answers to the interview questions; • is able to reason coherently, considering arguments for and against a position.
