

DATA PROCESSING NOTICE

regarding the processing of personal data in connection with registration for group workshops organised by the Student Wellbeing and Community Centre

2. LEGISLATION GOVERNING DATA PROCESSING

- Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation: GDPR);
- Act CXII of 2011 on the right to informational self-determination and freedom of information

3. SUBJECT MATTER OF DATA PROCESSING, SCOPE OF DATA PROCESSED, PURPOSE AND DURATION

The University's Student Wellbeing and Community Centre organises group programmes and workshops (hereinafter: events), for which registration is required.

This Data Processing Notice provides information on the processing of personal data carried out in connection with the above, in accordance with Article 13 of the GDPR.

4. ACCESS TO DATA AND DATA TRANSFER

Data may be accessed by CORVINUS staff involved in the organisation and running of the event for the purposes of performing their duties and to the extent necessary for that purpose. The University will only disclose data to third parties on the basis of statutory authorisation or with the data subject's consent.

5. ENGAGING A DATA PROCESSOR

CORVINUS does not use any data processors in connection with the data processing set out in this notice.

6. DATA SECURITY MEASURES

The University stores personal data on its own servers. It does not use the services of any other company for the storage of data. The University takes appropriate measures to ensure that personal data is protected against, amongst other things, unauthorised access, and to ensure the ongoing confidentiality, integrity, availability and resilience of the systems and services used to process personal data, as well as the ability, in the event of a physical or technical incident, to restore access to personal data and the availability of the data in a timely manner.

7. RIGHTS IN RELATION TO DATA PROCESSING

The data subject has the right to request information about the processing of their data, the right to request the rectification of their data, the right to request the blocking of their data (restriction of processing), and the right to request that the data controller provide them with their personal data and information relating to the processing thereof. The data subject is entitled to request the portability of their data, provided that the conditions set out in Article 20 of the GDPR are met. The data subject may request the erasure of their data. The data subject may withdraw their consent at any time. Withdrawal of consent does not affect the lawfulness of data processing carried out prior to such withdrawal. The data subject may object to the processing of their data and may also request the erasure of their data, provided that the conditions set out in Article 17 of the GDPR are met. A detailed description of the data subject's rights is set out in Chapter III of the GDPR (<https://eur-lex.europa.eu/legal-content/HU/TXT/HTML/?uri=CELEX:32016R0679>). The data subject may exercise their rights under this section by sending a request to the email address adatvedelem@uni-corvinus.hu.

8. LEGAL ENFORCEMENT IN RELATION TO DATA PROCESSING

In the event of unlawful data processing, the data subject may lodge a complaint with CORVINUS's Data Protection Officer, the National Authority for Data Protection and Freedom of Information (NAIH) or a court.
